God desires to empower those most overlooked and to bring comfort to those who suffer most. Will we see the greatness of God in the most unexpected ways? Will we let our smallness be a space for the Mighty One to do great things? Will we draw closer to our spiritual Mother, Mary, and allow her to open us up to the Lord's action in our lives?

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary – Some Musings

“My soul magnifies the Lord.”

The day was warm; a soft breeze whispered in the trees; the sky a porcelain blue salted here and there by white clouds, a day to give praise to the Lord if ever there was one. It was a day to sing Mary’s canticle of praise to our loving Father and Redeemer. As I write these words I’m reminded that no matter what a day holds for us it is a day to give praise to the Lord. There are so many things around us to remind us of the goodness of our Lord. They are usually small things and as a result we can often overlook them in our daily routines. I thank God for the blessings of hot water in which to have a shower, wash dishes and clothes. I thank Him for the person who invented seat belts, developed life-saving medications. I never fail to thank Him for food on my table, the warmth of my bed and clean water to drink. And always for the love, support and help of family and friends.

Mary, that blessed woman, has many reasons to praise God. She has been chosen to give birth to the Messiah, the One who will release people from the stain of that sin of our first parents, the One who will heal the sick, raise the dead and comfort the sorrowing. She does not know of His pain and suffering, nor of that arrow will pierce her own heart as she watches helplessly as He suffers and dies. Those of us who are parents know the dreams we have for our children; we know the hopes we have for their health and well-being and when they are hurt or sick or suffering in some way throughout their lives we are as concerned about them when they are fifty as we would be if they were five. We never stop being parents. I was reminded of this once when my parents were visiting from Alberta and were preparing to leave. My 72-year-old father, called his 93-year-old mother and I asked that when he was finished talking with her, I’d like to say hello to her as well. I had the phone extension in my hand as Dad said good-bye and told her the approximate date they expected to be back. I listened to my Granny say to her son, “Now you kids drive carefully.” No! We never stop being parents. Not knowing what lies in store for us is a true blessing. We need to put our trust in the Lord and ask Him to guide us as we journey through life confident that He will hold us close in times of trial, comfort us in times of sorrow, and rejoicing with us in times of celebration. Mary has no idea what lies ahead for her, her husband and her Son but she places her trust in the love of the God who made her and praises Him for His goodness. Our life journey is not always easy; we don’t always have blue skies or just the right amount of rain; we don’t always walk on pathways strewn with sweet smelling flowers, but we can rest in the promise of our Saviour who told us, “I will be with you until the end of the age.” Let’s place our firm trust in Him and walk with hope and peace toward Him, praising Him always and thanking Him for all those small miracles and blessings He sends our way each day.
