

12. RECTOR'S REPORT ON CHURCH PROJECT

On December 7, 2023, the last inspection of the insulation of the foundations of the Cathedral took place, thus completing this phase of the renovation of our Cathedral.

September 2022 - April 2023

* In the fall of 2022, we began to insulate the foundations of our cathedral. At that time, the foundations were exposed, and additional insulation was added. As a result of our work, we added R37 insulation to the existing insulation. In other words, our foundations now have about R50 insulation. This work was completed in January 2023. We paid about \$130K + architect 10K for this work.

May to November 2023

* In May, we completed the exterior duct work \$4K

* In May, we ordered the material to finish the foundations of the cathedral.

* In May, we found a contractor to insulate the walls of the Cathedral (the plan was for him to start in August 2023 and finish in November).

* In June, a new pavement was laid (north and west side of the cathedral), costing about \$20K

* During the summer, the architect and engineer continued to design the insulation of the cathedral walls. (Phase 2) \$25K

* In 2011, a permit was issued for an oil tank. The work was completed, but no one did a final inspection. Therefore, we now had to make the necessary changes and in August 2023 the permit finally passed the final inspection. \$5K

* In September, the contractor delayed entering the site and finally did not start work.

* In September, the material to finish the foundations was delivered from Japan Ceraclad Triple-Coated Rainscreen Siding System, FH7252A Granite Ft Brown. (We bought more material to finish the main entrance with the same material. But this will be done along with the insulation of the walls of the Cathedral.)

* In October, we found another contractor who agreed to insulate the walls of the Cathed ral by the end of December *(completion by mid-March).* This would allow us to take advantage of a 40% discount from Good Energy Solution. Unfortunately, the price was over our budget and the fundraising for the renovation was not progressing very fast. As a result, we could not begin this phase of the renovation of our cathedral.

* In early November, the contractor will install the Ceraclad \$ 38K (for materials and installation)

* Reconstruction of the stairs on the west side of the Cathedral \$6K

From Fall 2022 to April 2023, we spent about 140K on the renovation. (\$75K CDF, \$56K Good Energy Solution)

From May 2023 to date, we have spent about \$94K. During this time, we have collected about 36K for the renovation of the cathedral. Now I'm waiting for a 40% discount from Good Solution. I'm about \$20-30K short. In order to pay, I'll have to take the missing amount from the Long Term Deposit. -Fr. Slawomir Szwagrzyk, Parish Rector
