


ST. KATERI TEKAKWITHA, VIRGIN Protectress of Canada April 17th

The 2nd Sunday of Easter – Some Musings

"As the Father has sent Me, so I send you."

The red rim of the sun rose slowly over the trees giving the world below a crimson hue and bringing daylight to the barren earth below. It looked to be a splendid spring day but the temperatures belied that hope. The wind had very sharp teeth, tearing at any rent in clothing or any loose window or door. The one saving thing in all this was that the Lord had risen; He had appeared to the disciples and the women at the tomb and had opened to us the gates of heaven closed since the sin of our first parents. We have entered the Easter season during which we will hear of the appearances of Jesus to His followers and friends. We need to look for His appearance among us as well. We never know when we will meet Him, disguised perhaps as a lost child desperately looking for a parent who seems to be lost; or an individual looking for money to buy food. Jesus will appear in many strange guises. Each of them is like the risen Lord. And like Thomas do we say, "I will not believe unless there is some infallible proof for me"? It doesn't seem that Thomas is a skeptical person, just one that wants to make doubly sure of what he has been told by others. That kind of thinking can stand us in good standing when it comes to things others tell us that can seem so farfetched that they are hard to believe. Yet it often happens that we believe the most outrageous things we hear. All we need do is look at the tabloid magazines that have proliferated and cover our newsstands. But to believe that a person actually died and rose again to life? That could be difficult to believe. So one can understand why Thomas has difficulty believing what others tell him even though the Lord had told His disciples that He would be raised from the dead. When Thomas finally sees Jesus, alive, he believes instantly. "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe!" the Lord tells him. When we hear those words how much do we truly believe that Jesus died and rose from the dead? To be a person of faith means that we set aside what the world says is true and listen closely to what the Scriptures and the words of our Lord tell us is true. When we consider that our God created all that we see and know how can we doubt that He can do whatever He chooses to do? As we are told in the letter to the Hebrews, "Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen." When I look at the barren trees it can be difficult to believe that in a few short weeks these same trees will burst forth with a new life, green and fresh; we will see the earth awaken from its winter sleep and grace us once again with the glory of re-birth. Now I am not suggesting that we aren't careful about what we believe. We need guidance from our Church. We need to listen carefully to the homilies and continue to educate ourselves by reading the words of those doctors of the Church who can help us understand more fully what the

The skies are clear but for a few cotton wool clouds floating high above. I see hopeful signs of spring so as we begin our journey through this blessed season of Easter let's ask the breath of the Spirit to cleanse our spirits and hearts and grant us the joy that the risen Lord bought for us at a dreadful price and ask Him to help us to be grateful for His sacrifice and love.
