The Feast of the Body and Blood of our Lord – Some Musings

“This is My Body. This is My Blood.”

This gospel always brings to my mind two verses from Scripture – one from the Old Testament and one from the New Testament. In the Old Testament God tells through Isaiah that He has carved us on the palm of His hand and in the New Testament Jesus tells us that He will be with us until the end of the age. In the gospel for this weekend Jesus fulfills those promises when He leaves us His Body and Blood to sustain us on our earthly journey.

Jesus didn't say, “This bread is a symbol or a reminder of My Body.” No. He said, “This IS My Body.” “This IS My Blood.” When the early missionaries arrived on our soil many of the native peoples referred to them as “God Eaters” and that's truly what we are. When we place the Host in our mouths we are truly consuming our God and Saviour. I think if we really understood that fact our coming to Eucharist would be so much more reverent and devoted.

So many people dispute the fact that in that the wafer of bread and chalice of wine our Lord is in there. We don't dispute the fact when someone tells us a tree is a tree. That's because a tree looks like the thing we call a tree but in the transubstantiation of that bread and wine we don't see evidence that our Lord is present in all His glory and majesty. We need to recall Jesus' words to Thomas, “Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed.” Yes, blessed indeed. We seem to demand physical proof from God and He wants us to show Him how much faith we truly have. We hear the song of a bird and know whether it is a cardinal or a robin or a dove. Yet when it comes to faith in the deeds of our Lord and Saviour we want Him to “show us the money”. We can be a foolish and prideful people. And He loves us in spite of all that.

I see the work of His hands all around, He's present in the natural world and in the hearts and deeds of others. He doesn't “knock us up the side of head” to get our attention; He wants us to see Him when He crosses our path each day. We sometimes miss feeling His warmth in the deeds of others who are always there to lend a hand when we need one or to comfort us in times of sorrow. He's present in the whisper of the wind as it swooshes through the branches of the trees. And He's present in the stillness of the night and when we sit in quiet prayer and reflection. And He is truly present in that small wafer and the chalice. He is our Triune God; a God of majesty and glory but also a very personal companion as we journey through this life. Let's make sure to be very reverent as we consume His Body and Blood, remembering exactly who it is that enters our bodies. Jesus came to save the world and to ensure that we had strength to follow in His footsteps.

The other evening I sat on my deck and watched as the earth shed its mantle of bright sun and twilight fell over the earth. It was very still, no breeze, and the song of the little creek was soothing. As the sun slipped below the horizon the sky was emblazoned with rich colours of purple, pink and orange: The sunset brought a great peace over me as I watched the colours fade, deepen and change. It was a time for me to thank our Saviour who had come to us as a person just like you and me and who left us a rich feast to sustain us on our journey.


