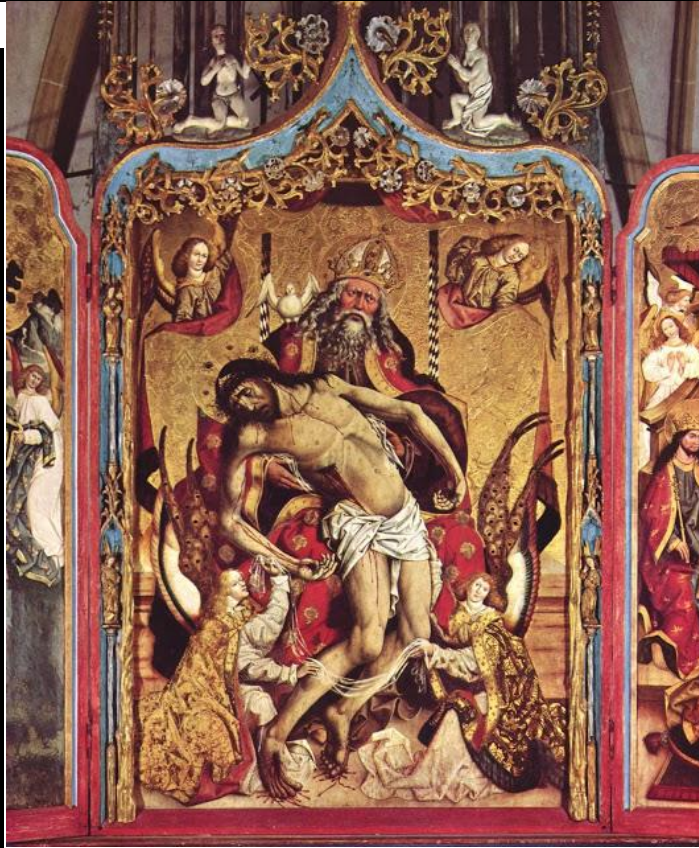

### Feast of the Holy Trinity – Some Musings

*“In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.”*

We kneel to pray, make the sign of the cross: We sit to eat and make the sign of the cross. We say, “In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit”. Many of us make the sign of the cross throughout the day as we ask for assistance with a troubling problem, or in thanksgiving. It’s the sign of our faith. It was said by the priest or deacon when we were baptized and when we were confirmed. It’s a commissioning phrase as we’re sent to preach the Good News of salvation to all with whom we come in contact. That phrase is not only the sign of our faith in our Church, when we make the sign of the cross and say, “In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit we are calling on the name of our Triune God so we’d best make that sign and say those words with reverence and devotion.

When we fail to do so we can always advantage ourselves of the wonderful healing sacrament of reconciliation. When I consider all that the Lord has done for us I feel humbled by His goodness and often shamed at my own lack of faith. As His adopted children, we need to love and obey Him at all times: We need to do His will and work to help build the kingdom here. He has not asked us to redeem the world – His only begotten Son has done that in our place, but we do need to call on the Holy Spirit to strengthen us. He asks us only to “do justice, love mercy and walk humbly with [our] God”.

I look around me and see the beauty of the earth He created – the trees dressed in various shades of green, some still not in full leaf. I watch as the sun rises and sets and brushes the sky with colour, sometimes so vibrant that it takes our breath away and at others so subtle that it leaves us with a deep sense of peace and tranquility. And I recall the words of one of my sons when he was only four as he looked in wonder at a lovely sunset. “God sure finger paints good doesn’t He, Mom.” Yes, He certainly does that! I hear the sound of frog song and bird song so varied in tone but creating a harmony of sound that it surpasses sounds of a well-trained choir. I hear the sound of the little creek behind, as it makes its way to its destination. And He has put us, His often recalcitrant and disobedient children in charge of all this glory and wonder He has created.

This God loves and trusts us and we need to live as His obedient children, working toward making His will prevalent in our lives and in the world. If we do that we can be assured that He will walk with us supporting us as we journey and work in His fields. Ours is a God that we know will never abandon us or leave us to our own devices: He has, after all, left us His Church, His word, and His sacraments to uphold and support us. Let’s endeavor to be the people He’s called us to be and live by His commandments and decrees.

Wishing you a week of many small miracles.

## *Our Lady Untier of Knots*



Pope Francis will lead the faithful in the prayer of the Rosary on Monday, 31 May, at the conclusion of the month-long Marathon of Prayer for an end to the Covid-19 pandemic.

For the final night of prayer, Pope Francis asked that an image of Our Lady Untier of Knots be set up in the Vatican Gardens, which will serve as an open-air shrine for the occasion.

The Holy Father has always had a strong devotion toward the image, which comes originally from Augsburg, Germany. The 18th century painting shows the Blessed Virgin Mary untying knots in a white ribbon held by two angels, surrounded by biblical scenes expressive of hope, mercy, and victory over evil.

Pope Francis has chosen five special prayer intentions for the concluding ceremony, five “knots” to be untied:

The first is “wounded relationality, loneliness, and indifference,” which have grown worse during the pandemic.

The second knot is unemployment, especially the challenges for young people, women, and fathers of families, as well as those facing businessmen working to defend and protect their employees. The “drama of violence” — especially violence that originates in the home, violence against women, and violence that comes as a result of social tensions exacerbated by the current crisis — is the third knot.

The Pope’s fourth intention relates to “human progress,” which should be supported by scientific research in such a way that discoveries might be accessible to all, “especially the weakest and the poorest.”

Finally, the Pope will pray for pastoral care, that Catholic communities might regain their enthusiasm and feel a new impetus in all areas of pastoral life; and that young people might be able to marry and build a family and a future.

At the conclusion of the celebration on Monday evening, Pope Francis will solemnly crown the image of Mary, Untier of Knots.
