FOR SOULS IN PURGATORY

(*November 1-8*) A Plenary Indulgence is applicable only to the souls in purgatory. It is granted each day. Those who devoutly visit a cemetery, a church or an oratory and pray for the departed, they are granted this indulgence. A plenary indulgence is granted for each day for a different soul in purgatory. When you visit a cemetery at this time you should **recite these prayers: Our Father, The Creed, and Eternal Rest Prayer.** (*"Eternal rest grant to them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen."*) **This can be prayed all year, but especially during the month of November.**

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR OBTAINING A PLENARY INDULGENCE:

- Do the work while in a **state of grace.**
- Receive Sacramental **confession** (*several plenary indulgences may be earned per reception. i.e. If you want to earn one plenary indulgence for souls in purgatory, each day of the week from Nov. 1-8 you need only to go to confession once, but you must fulfill the other requirements listed each day.*)
- Receive **Eucharistic Communion** (*one plenary indulgence may be earned per reception.*)
- Pray **for the pope's intentions** (*Our Father and Hail Mary, or other appropriate prayer, is enough.*)
- **Have no attachment to sin** (even venial) - i.e., it is enough that the Christian makes an act of will to love God and despise sin.

If you are not able to fulfill all these requirements but only accomplish them in part, you can receive a partial indulgence.

RE: NEW PRIESTS IN THE DIOCESE

Bishop Vila would like to welcome **Fr. Leo Maung Kyaw Win and Fr. Michael Aung Naing Win** to the Diocese of Whitehorse who have graciously answered God's call to serve in the missions. Fr. Leo has been a diocesan priest in the Archdiocese of Yangon in Myanmar for fourteen years. He has served in several roles in Myanmar including Associate Pastor, Spiritual Director at a major seminary, and Priest in Charge of Seafarers. Most recently, he was a Pastor at St. Lazarus Church.

Fr. Michael is a religious priest of the Missionary of St. Paul's Congregation in Myanmar. He was ordained in 2018 and served as an Associate Pastor for four years in two churches within the Archdiocese of Yangon and the Diocese of Pha-an.

Both Fr. Leo and Fr. Michael will spend some time in Whitehorse adjusting to Canadian culture, the northern climate, and our way of life. During this period, they will also travel together regularly to Watson Lake to celebrate Masses at St. Ann Catholic Mission and nearby communities. They will be assigned a mission at a later date.

Please greet the Fathers when you see them, and keep them in their prayers as they adapt to their new ministries here in Canada.
