3. Indulgence for the Souls in Purgatory

Obtaining indulgences by the faithful in the Catholic Church is a centuries-old tradition. Throughout history, there have been many opinions on this topic. There have been times when, through the improper treatment of indulgences, very serious abuses have occurred. During the Second Vatican Council, it was realized that indulgences are a very important matter. For this reason, on January 1, 1967, Paul VI, promulgated a revised doctrine on the practice of indulgences as inscribed in the Apostolic Constitution *Indulgentiarum Doctrina*. When Canon Lawwas established in 1983, John Paul II put high emphasis on this subject *(Canon 992-997)*.

An indulgence is partial or plenate, depending on whether it relieves from temporal punishment in part or in whole. Paul VI abolished indulgences determined by a specific time (e.g. the number of days or years), because there is no time in eternity. A plenary indulgence assures that God remits to man all temporal punishments due for sins, already forgiven as to guilt in the sacrament of penance. Obtaining a plenary indulgence for oneself avoids the punishments of purgatory, while obtaining a plenary indulgence for the dead saves souls from purgatory. A partial indulgence, on the other hand, assures a partial remission of temporal punishments by God.

It should be remembered that the faithful can obtain a partial or plenary indulgence only for himself, or offer it for the deceased but for no one living, since each person is able to transform his or her own life and fulfill the conditions required to receive the indulgence. A plenary indulgence can be obtained only once in a day, except for those facing death, while partial indulgences can be obtained several times in a single day.

Souls who are already experiencing the glory of Heaven are asking for the graces we need on earth.

From <u>November 1st to 8th</u> we have a <u>special time of grace</u>. In these days we can obtain great gifts for the souls in purgatory. We would like to remind you what conditions must be met.





FAMILY CATECHESIS

Introduction

The General Directory for Catechesis (GDC) tells us that "catechesis is nothing other than the process of transmitting the Gospel, as the Christian community has received it, understands it, celebrates it, lives it and communicates it in many ways" (105). Catechesis is about much more than passing on information; it is formation which leads to transformation. Family catechesis occurs in all stages of life. As families live their daily lives and interact with one another, they deepen their relationship with Jesus Christ. "Family catechesis therefore precedes, accompanies and enriches all forms of catechesis" (Catechesi Tradendae 68). Church documents stress that families can only grow in relationship with Christ with the help of the Christian community. Therefore it is important that the Church tend to the needs of families, and in a particular way, to parents as the first educators in the faith. Family catechesis ensures the Gospel message is the lived experience of the entire family. As Pope Francis reminds us, "the family is not merely the sum of persons belonging to it, but a 'community of persons' (cf. nn. 17-18). And a community is more than the sum total of persons that belong to it. It is the place where one learns to love, it is the natural centre of human life. It is made up of faces, of people who love, dialogue, make self-sacrifices for one another and defend life, especially of the most vulnerable and the weakest" (Address of Pope Francis to Participants in the Plenary Assembly of the Pontifical Council for the Family, 2013).

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
