November 19, Sunday: Theme: Doing Small Things Well

WORLD DAY OF THE POOR

**ANTIPHON:** Jeremiah 29.11, 12, 14 The Lord said: I think thoughts of peace and not of affliction. You will call upon me, and I will lead back your captives from every place.

**READING 1:** Proverbs 31. 10-13, 16-18, 20, 26, 28-31++ *She works with willing hands.* 

10Who can find a woman of worth? 




