

GUIDE TO SCRIPTURAL READINGS AND MEDITATIONS FOR 32nd WEEK IN ORDINARY TIME-YEAR A

November 12, Sunday: Theme: Windows to Your Soul

ANTIPHON: cf. Psalm 87:3 Let my prayer come into Your presence. Incline Your ear to my cry for help, O Lord.

READING 1: Wisdom 6.12-16 Wisdom is found by those who seek her.

12Resplendent and unfading is Wisdom, and she is readily perceived by those who love her, and found by those who seek her. 13She hastens to make herself known to those who desire her; 14one who watches for her at dawn will not be disappointed, for she will be found sitting at the gate. 15For setting your heart on her is the perfection of prudence, and whoever keeps vigil for her is quickly free from care; 16Because she makes her rounds, seeking those worthy of her, and graciously appears to them on the way, and goes to meet them with full attention. 12

RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Psalm 63:1, 2-3, 4-5, 6-7 Response: 1a

Come out to meet him!' 7Then all those virgins got up and trimmed their lamps. 8The foolish ones said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil, for our lamps are going out.' 9But the wise ones replied, 'No, for there may not be enough for us and you. RESPONSORIAL PSALM: Psalm 139, 1-3, 4-6, 7-8, 9-10 R24b

RESPONSE: Guide me. Lord. along the everlasting way.

GOSPEL: Luke 17. 1-6 If the same person sins against you seven times a day, and turns back to you seven times and says, 'I repent', you must forgive.

Prayer:

My most compassionate Lord, You love the sinner and deeply desire that they turn to You in their need. Please give me Your heart of compassion so that I will be free to love them as You love them. May I never become an instrument of temptation for them to fall further away from You but, instead, become an instrument of Your unfailing mercy. Jesus, I trust in You. (My Catholic Life)

RESPONSE: I will the Lord at all times.

As a Tribute to the Women Saints, the PARABLE of the Bridesmaids is highlighted as it is our Gospel this Sunday.

The PARABLE OF THE Bridesmaids comes as Jesus moves from the teaching stage of His ministry into the days of His Passion and crucifixion. He is calling on His disciples to stay alert. Jesus knows they must be ready to carry the Good News into the world.

We too can be preoccupied with the day-to-day, and easily distracted. Still, Jesus calls us, as people who believe, to stay close and pay attention. We are His disciples in our time and place.

In 1982, the Bride I met in a faith communitywhere we spent a year volunteering to help street kids. There was a daily rhyth m to our prayer life that included Mass, as well as morning, evening and midnight prayer. As the years passed and we became parents of six children, Sunday Mass remained our priority; however, our spiritual practices changed to include prayer with the children, on the way to the school in the morning, before meals and bedtime.

Today, we stay close to the Lord, albeit often on the run. While daily mass is the priority, I pray the Rosary while Jennifer calls on the Lord through more spontaneous prayer. We believe the intentional, daily effort to live in the right direction, and, hopefully, ready when the Lord calls. – Harry Mc Avoy. Newmarket. ON
