The 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time – Some Musings

“Give therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar’s and to God the things that are God’s “

The temperatures may be cooling but the colors on the trees! Oh! They are so diverse giving the land behind me the appearance of a beautiful multi-colored blanket, quilted by a loving hand. The sun has been shining and gilding those leaves with a brightness that we seldom see even in the early days of spring. Autumn is a time for me to take inventory of my life, physical, mental and spiritual. It’s a time of reflection on the deeds the Lord has done in my life and in the world around. I can take for granted the glory of the world in which I live, often forgetting to thank the Lord for His goodness and mercy to His people.

There are many things wrong in world – we have disease, dissent, disagreements leading to war. We have dysfunction in our families and in our relationships with others of differing opinions and beliefs. And many times, we hear people say, “Why does God do this?” or “Why doesn’t God do something about this?” We forget that God didn’t cause the problem; we did. We cause these problems when we fail to obey the two great commandments – love the Lord your God and your neighbor as yourself. The first of those commandments is “Love the Lord your God with your whole heart, your whole mind and your whole soul.” That means putting God first in all things. He is our Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier and everything we have and are comes from Him. Keeping that fact firmly in mind should enable us to put Him first in all we do. How do our days begin? I should think with a few moments spent in quiet prayer. I have found that my day goes so much better if I begin it with those moments of quiet reflection and thanksgiving. If I don’t do that the day just seems off balance.

Over and above that, I think we’re meant to go through our days going about our daily tasks as we’ve always done but remembering to do those tasks for the glory of God. As I welcomed each class into my classroom, I’d say a quiet little prayer that became a mantra for me, “Dear Lord, keep a guard over my lips and help me witness to your love to these young people.” It wasn’t much but it did keep me focused on what I was meant to do and be as a teacher. You see, I believe that we don’t teach religion to young people, they “catch” faith from the way in which we live our lives. We need to give to God, the things that are God’s and we do this by clinging to His law of love and justice. If we are to lead others to the Lord then it’s important to live lives that heal, help and give hope to others.

Giving to God what belongs to Him means living with joy and peace, with hope and security. So, as we come closer to the end of this liturgical year we should endeavor to put the Lord first in all things. It’s quite simple really; it just means keeping His laws and precept firmly planted while going about our daily lives.

CATHEDRAL RENOVATIONS

The Cathedral and basement windows will cost \$123,000. Now we are waiting for the final approval from the Good Energy Program at the Yukon Energy Branch, and the CDF (*if we receive this grant*). Once approved we will start to install the windows in the CYO hall and the Cathedral.

This weekend the window installation will begin only in the foyer of the cathedral. (*We have applied for CDF funding only for the cathedral windows not the front entrance windows.*)

We have planned to hopefully allow for stain glass windows in the long-term plan. (*The costs for stained glass windows is \$400,000. Due to our present needs and expenses the stained glass windows will be left for later.*) In the meantime, we have a light tint on the windows to decrease the intensity of the sun during the bright summer months. We want your input before we put them throughout the whole cathedral.

A great big thank you to all our generous benefactors! I am thrilled to announce that, up to now, we have raised \$45, 000!

- Il n’y aura **qu’un chant d’entrée et un de sortie** pour diminuer les risques. Un Prions et la feuille des chants sera sur la petite table à l’arrière.
- Pour la **Communion respectez la distanciation (2m/6 pieds). Les personnes au jubé doivent rester au jubé, la communion leur sera apportée.**
- La **toilette est disponible pour urgence seulement.** Devra être **désinfectée après usage.**
- **Nous désinfectons tout ce qui a été touché avant de laisser l’église.**
