



CONFIRMATION CLASSES starts on October 16, 2023 in the CYO Hall.





Update on our Energy Retrofit

Spring of this year – Insulation of the basement (CYO Hall)

During the spring of this year, we completed the insulation of the basement, including CYO Hall. In May, we made our final payment of \$129,650 for the additional insulation.

40% of the project cost was covered by a grant from the Energy Solutions Centre. We also received a grant from CDF of \$75,000.00 Additionally, we paid an advance of approximately \$10,000 for new basement exterior siding to cover the newly installed insulation that extends above ground level on the outside of the building.

To insulate the basement walls, we had to excavate around the foundations. As part of this process, the sidewalks on the west and north sides of the church were removed and later replaced with new sidewalks upon completion of the insulation work (\$20,450.00).

Spring and Summer of this year – Architectural Design

During the summer, the architect completed the drawings for the insulation project on the main floor of the cathedral. We made a payment of \$18,000 for this work. The total cost for the architect's services is estimated to be around \$45,000. Until now, we have paid approximately 75% of this total expected cost.

Fall of this year – Siding for the Basement Exterior Walls and an Exterior Door

On September 28th, we signed a contract to install the basement siding. The estimated total cost for this project is of approximately \$38,900, with an initial payment of \$10,000 already made. The basement siding is expected to be installed by the end of October (middle of November).

Earlier this year, our church was unfortunately broken into on two separate occasions. As a result, we are now in need of a new door for the cathedral. This incident has presented us with an opportunity to upgrade this door to a better-insulated one. Our goal is to find sufficient funds to invest in a new, high-quality, well-insulated commercial-quality door.

Fundraising

To pay all the renovation bills (not counting the front door) we need about \$50,000. From June 20 up until today, thanks to your generosity and God's providence, we've raised \$13,800. Therefore, we now need to raise \$36,200.

Church Furnace

We earnestly regret to inform you that our Church Furnace is not functioning since September 7, 2023. However, we are working on it and we are waiting for the delivery of the needed spare parts to finish the essential repair and maintenance works. We are very sorry for the discomfort and inconvenience inside the Church because of a colder am biance. Hence, you are encourage to enhance the warmth of your "Outfit-of-the Day" / clothing when you come to our Holy Mass Celebrations.


Celebrating the Commemorations of the Saints For the 26th Week

October 1: Feast of St. Therese of the Child Jesus.

St. Thérèse of the Child Jesus, also known as St. Thérèse of Lisieux or the Little Flower, was a **French Carmelite nun who is widely venerated for her spiritual accomplishments**¹²³. She was born Marie-Françoise-Thérèse Martin on January 2, 1873 in Alençon, France, and lost her mother at the age of four ¹²³. She entered the Carmelite convent at 15 and lived a life of humility, simplicity, and trust in God ¹²³. She died of tuberculosis on September 30, 1897, and was canonized in 1925 ¹². She is the patroness of the missions, florists, and soldiers. (MS Bing)



St Bruno was Founder of the Carthusian Order, a strict monastic order that follows a life of silence, prayer, and penance. He was born in Cologne around 1030 and was a renowned scholar and teacher. He died in 1101 in a monastery in Calabria, where he settled with some of his followers. He was canonized in 1514 and is the patron of exorcists and possessed persons.



Memorial



This Memorial joriginally 'Our Lady of Victuries') commenscrates the battle of Leponts (7 October 1571), when this Crisitian fired defoated the Turks. The victory was attributed by Pupe St Puss V to the rocitation of the Budy Rosary. This great Maxian prayer is sometimes traced back to \$1 Dominic de Castroni and his conferon, preaching against the Albigensian becopy in the 13° century, atthrough it seems more Body to have ite familiar form in the 15° century.

St Faustina Kowalska was a Polish nun who was chosen by Jesus and Mary yo spread the message of Divine Mercy. Some facts about her life include: Her given name was Helena and born on August 25, 1905. She didn't plan to become a nun, but had a vision of Jesus at age 19 that changed her mind. She joined the Congregation pf the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy in 1925 and took the name Maria Faustina. She had mystical experiences of Jesus and Mary, who asked her to write a diary and promote the devotion of the Divine Mercy. She died on October 5, 1938, and was canonized by Pope John Paul on April 30, 2000. Her Feast Day is October 5.
