3. For Souls in Purgatory

A Plenary Indulgence is applicable only to the souls in purgatory. It is granted each day from November 1-8.

Those who devoutly visit a cemetery, a church or an oratory and pray for the departed, they are granted this indulgence. A plenary indulgence is granted for each day for a different soul in purgatory. When you visit a cemetery at this time you should recite these prayers: Our Father, The Creed, and Eternal Rest Prayer: "Etemal rest grant to them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May the souls of the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen." This can be prayed all year, but especially during the month of November.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR OBTAINING A PLENARY INDULGENCE:

- Do the work while in a state of grace.
- Receive Sacramental confession (several plenary indulgences may be eamed per reception. i.e. If you want to earn one plenary indulgence for souls in purgatory, each day of the week from Nov. 1-8 you need only to go to confession once, but you must fulfill the other requirements listed each day).
- Receive **Eucharistic Communion** (one plenary indulgence may be earned per reception).
- Pray for the pope's intentions (Our Father and Hail Mary, or other appropriate prayer, is enough).
- Have no attachment to sin (even venial) i.e., it is enough that the Christian makes an act of will to love God and despise sin.
- If you are not able to fulfill all these requirements but only accomplish them in part, you can receive a partial indulgence.

October 29, Sunday: Theme: THE GREATEST COMMANDMENT

ANTIPHON: cf. Psalm 104:3-4 Let the heart that seek the Lord rejoice, turn to the Lord and His strength; constantly seek His face.

READING 1: Exodus 22: 21-27 If you abuse any widow or orphan, my wrath will burn you.

21You shall not wrong any widow or orphan. 22If ever you wrong them and they cry out to me, I will surely listen to their cry. 23My wrath will flare up, and I will kill you with the sword; then your own wives will be widows, and your children orphans. 24g If you lend money to my people, the poor among you, you must not be like a money lender; you must not demand interest from them. 25If you take your neighbor's cloak as a pledge, you shall return it to him before sunset; 26for this is his only covering; it is the cloak for his body. PRAY THE HOLY ROSARY DAILY!

The 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Some Musings

"I will listen for I am compassionate."

The golden sun sank slowly down the western sky leaving the earth in a deep darkness as the moon hid behind clouds even though it was waxing toward the full. It was a cool night and the only sounds breaking the silence were the soft cooing of the doves sitting on the deck and the fingertips of the trees reaching toward one another as their gentle voices scratched through the quiet. As I stood wa tching, suddenly the moon peeked through a small rent in the cloud cover and cast moonshadows on the earth below. That sight enriched my evening hour and I thanked my heavenly Father that I had been present to witness it. It was just another of those small miracles that God sends our way each and every day.

"Love the Lord your God and your neighbour as yourself." Sounds so easy doesn't it? But it's not always easy to do. Love is a hard thing to accomplish. We must first learn to love ourselves and sometimes that seems a bit egoistical. "Love your neighbour", not always easy either. But if we cannot love those we can see how much more challenging is it to love God whom we cannot see. We love the beauty that surrounds us, that is the work of God's hands; but do we love HIM? Perhaps that's part of the reason that the Father sent His Son – so we'd have a human God whom we could love.

There is great peace in the knowledge that God loved us before we loved Him and He continues to love us no matter how much we push against that enduring love of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. If we, flawed humans as we are, still continue to love our children no matter what they do or where they go, how much more does the Father love us?

But God does not set the bar so high that we can never reach it.

We are not meant to spend all our days professing our great love of God on every street corner. Rather we demonstrate that love by our works of charity and help for the people who live with and around us. When we offer help to someone in need, when we comfort someone who is suffering, when we feed those less fortunate than we are, and when we do those things not because we will be lauded for our generousity but because we want to do our part in building a better more caring world, we do it for love of Him. If we look c losely at all God as done for us: He sent His Son to open for us the gates of Heaven, He surrounds us with the beauty of creation, He blesses us with rain and sun, we should come to Him in humility and love and thank Him for all these gifts. I've said before that if we really knew how to look at life, all life would become a prayer. It's the reason that I have little rituals asking His blessing on my daily tasks. These tasks will not change the world, but they are a blessing in my life. Asking His blessing on these mundane little jobs raises them to a higher level and are small prayers. When I say, "God help me." I mean just that, knowing that with His help I can do what needs to be done to accomplish those little tasks that can often annoy me. The sun struggled through the clouds the other morning and yet with His help, I knew that my day would hold for me those little miracles.
