Pentecost occurs 50 days after the death and resurrection of Jesus, and ten days after his ascension into heaven. Pentencost is the celebration of the person of the Holy Spirit coming upon the Apostles, Mary and first followers of Jesus, who were gathered together in the Upper Room. A "Strong, driving" wind filled the room where they were gathered and tongues of fire came to rest on their heads, allowing them to speak in different languages so that they could understand each other. The Holy Spirit also gave the apostles the other gifts and fruits necessary to fulfill the great commission – to go out and preach the Gospel to all nations.

Glory be to the Father and to the son and to the Holy Spirit as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever! Amen.


ACT OF CONSECRATION TO THE MOST SACRED HEARTS OF JESUS & MARY

The Feast of Pentecost – Some Musings

"As the Father has sent me, so I send you."

We were given a brief glimpse into spring in the last weeks but it seems that Mother Nature was just playing with us as it's turned a bit cooler in the past few days. The sky is overcast and the wind is sharp, not friendly at all. I've had my fireplace on most evenings and while it's a cheery blaze, it does little to alleviate my cold feet. I'm not a fan of cold weather and the dreariness of the days leaves me feeling melancholy. However, the wind does seem to make me feel less lethargic. Perhaps that's the effect that wind from heaven had on the apostles. Jesus sends them on a mission to spread His gospel throughout the world and sends the Holy Spirit to give them strength and courage. We need to remember that we were given those same strengthening gifts at our confirmation. And we too, have been sent.

Since we have been sent, we need to be prepared to spread His word, His joy and His peace to all we encounter throughout our day. That heavenly wind is meant to uplift us and help us to carry out our mission as His disciples in this time and place. We should take our role as disciples seriously and not miss opportunities to lead others to the Lord. When I hear of those thousands being converted in a short period of time I am ashamed of all those missed opportunities in my own life when I neglected to be His witness; my sins of omission. We never know if that missed opportunity is the only time an individual had a chance to hear or see the Lord's message lived out, or to have one's faith strengthened. We may be the only person that person will ever have contact with for that renewal to occur.

We have been baptized as "priest, prophet and king." We have been sent to take the good news to the poor. As I considered this I recalled something I found many years ago and I'd like to share that with you now.

It's called simply "Who Me?"

"And the Lord said, "Go!" And I said, "Who? Me?" And He said, "Yes! You." "But I'm not ready yet. And there's company coming. I can't leave my work and there's no one to take my place." And the Lord said, "You're stalling." And the Lord said, "Go!" And I said, "I don't want to!" and the Lord said, "I didn't ask if you wanted to!"

And I said, "Listen! I'm not the kind of person to get involved in controversy. Besides my family wouldn't like it and what would my friends think." and the Lord said, "Baloney!" And yet a third time the Lord said, "Go!" And I said, "Do I have to?" And the Lord said, "Do you love Me?" And I said, "Look. I'm scared. People are going to hate me and cut me up in small pieces and I can't take that all by myself!" And the Lord said, "Where do you think I'll be?" And the Lord said, "Go." And I sighed, "Here I am. Send me."

We can do the same sort of things: we stall, we make excuses, sometimes we just try to run and hide knowing full well that hiding from the Lord is a futile business. When He calls and asks us to go and carry His message, let's answer with, "Here I am, send me." We should take Him at His word, "Where do you think I'll be?" We need to believe that He is right there with us and all we need do is call on His assistance.

"As the Father has sent Me, so I send you." If we answer that call we may feel like a ship without

a rudder at times but knowing we can rely on His promise will give us the courage to stand fast in the face of all the storms and turbulence that as Hamlet tells us, "flesh is heir to". But with Him as the Captain of the ship, we'll find the sailing smooth and productive. So let's answer that call to "Go" with enthusiasm and joy that we have been called by our Lord to carry on His work. Let's dust off our lazy faith practice and become the people who will carry on His work and lead others to the table of His love and His Body and Blood, knowing He will be there when we need help. Jesus did not just call twelve men to be His disciples; each of us has been baptized into that

service, He called you and me and if not us, then who?
