SYNOD UPDATE - With the new year upon us, Synod meetings have begun in our diocese. At Sacred Heart Cathedral, the first of three meetings was held this past week with the topic: “How do we celebrate together in the Church?”. The topic at the meeting next month will be: “How does the Holy Spirit inspire us when we communicate with each other in the Church and with others outside the Church?” Remember that you can also organize your own small group meetings, or submit a personal reflection. The 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time – Some Musings

"Do whatever He tells you."

It's another of the cold winter days with below zero temperatures but the sun is shining and as I stand by my window, that sun warms me. Even in the dreariest days there is always a bright ray of sun, whether it's the actual sun or the warmth of a friend's call, a visit from my son or that long awaited call from a dear friend far away. Finding joy in these days of rising pandemic numbers is one way to keep me grounded and hopeful in this very difficult time. I've found that finding that joy in the seeming small things colours my day with bright colours and happy memories of that particular day. At the end of each day I examine my often wayward conscience and ask forgiveness for the times that I did not live the life of a true disciple. But I also look for those little things that gave me joy or peace or comfort and thank my God for them. We can spend a great deal of time looking for those big moments that will take our breath away and as a result we miss all those lovely moments that make our breath catch in our throats.

I think that Jesus wants us to be joyful in His service. His very first miracle as we see in this gospel was performed at a festive gathering – a wedding at which our Lord did not want to see the host put to shame for not having enough wine. It has always made me ponder; Jesus performed His first miracle by turning water into wine and His last miracle by changing wine into His own precious Blood at the Last Supper. We've just begun that liturgical season we call

Ordinary Time and it is in this very ordinary life most of us live, it's a time to find joy in the ordinary things in our lives. We cannot always live in the times of the great feasts of our Church but finding joy and comfort in the ordinary things in our lives can mean a great deal if we live those times loving our God and our neighbours.

Jesus wants only good for us and so often we miss those times when the hand of our Lord was laid upon our plans and, if you will, saved the day. We sometimes call this a coincidence, but I prefer to call them 'small miracles', miracles of hope, of joy, times we're given courage or peace. Yes, they may be small miracles but we do not live in the times of seas parting do we? We live in these ordinary times with the small miracles to remind us that our Lord is with us.

As we begin our journey through Ordinary Time, let's appreciate all those small miracles that come to us each day and love one another with the love of true Christians. Let's take every opportunity to thank our God for His many blessings, especially His unfailing love and concern for us all.





SAINT SEBASTIAN




