



Winter, it seems, does not want to let spring in either the front or back door. The wintery blast that I hear moaning around my windows and doors belies the date on the calendar that tells me spring has arrived. Spring is indecisive this year, not certain whether it should come or just let Old Man Winter have his way in our world. And it hardly seems possible that soon we'll be celebrating the great feast of Easter which has its own dichotomy of horror, sorrow and finally great rejoicing as we celebrate this Pascal Feast, the feast of our salvation. It's time for us to take these words to heart, "and from now on do not sin anymore." I've always thought it so appropriate that the feast of Easter, falls in the spring of the year.


Spring is the time when the world seems to burst with new life, new growth, new hope. The colours are vibrant; the green leaves looking newly washed by rain; the flowers blooming with exuberant life. The whole world puts on a rich mantle of life and growth. As we celebrate this Feast of feasts we, too, should shed our old ways of worship and praying, finding ways to make them more vibrant and meaningful. We are meant to live life to the fullest, and as St. Paul tells us, not in carefree living but in living with purpose; living as His children.

He already has an army who surround us and if we don't remain vigilant we will fall prey to their enticements. I wonder how that woman caught in adultery fared after Jesus had forgiven her and sent her on her way. Did she stay free from sin or like most us, did she fall back to sinful ways?

Ours is a caring, compassionate Lord and He knows our every thought and weakness and in His love and concern for our salvation He chose to die on the cross to redeem us but He also gave us His Sacraments to forgive, heal and strengthen us. We need to advantage ourselves of these graces and attend the Sacraments as often as possible. Those Sacraments are meant to be a sustaining part of our lives and make a remarkable difference in our faith lives.

As we celebrate this Feast of Easter, not just the day but the entire time from the death and resurrection to the Feast of Pentecost let's make sure we commit ourselves to living better, more fruitful lives in His service and the service of others. Let's not be like spring, indecisive about whether we should act or not when we see a need that we can fill. Let's be messengers of His love and healing compassion throughout, not only this time, but through our entire lives. Let's pray fervently and devotedly to our Lord, knowing that our prayers will be answered and be willing to accept that answer when it comes, trusting in His grace and love.
