5. Questions and Comments arising from Parish Reports	<p>A general comment was made about the many things going on within the parish and that we should be proud of everything that is happening. It was noted, however, that there is a lack of volunteers in many of the ministries – notably Liturgy of the Word and Music.</p> <p>1. Sacred Heart Parish (Rector) – A question was raised about when children should consider being altar servers – Fr. Slawomir suggested after First Holy Communion has been received is best, but there can certainly be exceptions. The seminarians are mentoring them very nicely. Fr. Slawomir acknowledged the change in Mass times was difficult but was necessary – it was acknowledged that the additional options were appreciated, and that the 10:30 am Mass is less busy than ever before, but the Saturday 5:00 pm, Sunday 9:00 am and 7:00 pm numbers seem to be going up.</p> <p>2. Music Ministry – There were questions about the note about looking for new hymnals – this is not an active effort, the music ministry is scanning for options that might be a good blend of traditional and contemporary, and would include some new parts of the Mass (with the words reflecting the new translation). A group is working on learning some of the parts of the Mass in plainchant.</p> <p>5. Children’s Alternate Liturgy – no questions.</p> <p>6. CAT Chat – no questions.</p> <p>7.
