

We pray for small and medium sized businesses; in the midst of economic and social crisis, may they find ways to continue operating, and serving their communities.




Memo from the Chancery  
Re: Our Lady of the Cape Pilgrim Statue Tour

Most Rev. Héctor Vila is pleased to announce the visit of Our Lady of the Cape to the Diocese of Whitehorse. This three-week pilgrim statue tour will take place at the end of the summer from August 26th to September 16th, 2022. This year marks the 75th Anniversary of the Consecration of Canada to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. These Marian tours are happening this year in various dioceses across Canada to provide opportunities to venerate Canada's National Madonna and to promote the on-going consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The last time the statue visited our diocese was in 1953. Once again, we are blessed to have this occasion for renewal, healing and unity within our diocese through the intercession of our Blessed Mother Mary. Some events will begin in mid-August with public screenings of the film Bridge of Roses: The Story of Our Lady of the Cape in each parish and mission. This will be followed by activities in individual communities throughout our diocese, in the Catholic schools in Whitehorse, and other locations. 

## The 19<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time – Some Musings

*“Do not be afraid, little flock.”*

The other afternoon we were given a tornado watch, letting us know that we should prepare ourselves in case that disaster happened. It was a “heads-up” so we wouldn’t be caught unaware of possible damage. Most of us would heed that warning. In today’s gospel Jesus is giving us another “heads-up” so we can prepare for His second coming in glory. He is not warning us so that we live in fear of that second Coming, rather He is telling us how it is we are meant to love others the way we love ourselves. He knows that human nature is weak and subject to many pitfalls but we are meant to do our very best to live according to His word. So often in Scripture we hear the Lord telling us, His people, to be prepared but not afraid. He is there to strengthen and assist us in our earthly journey. We’ve heard it said that “he with the most toys wins.” Really? Hoarding our possessions and our gifts and not using them wisely is misusing those very things. We are given these gifts to be used in His service and so store up for ourselves those treasures that are not subject to decay. If we all used our gifts for the good of others our world would look much different than it does now. It would be a world where no one goes hungry, no one is thirsty, no one is without the basic necessities of life.

We are a community not meant to live in isolation or to care only for ourselves but that is often the way we live. We don’t want to make ourselves short of those necessities that we frequently hoard. Certainly taking care of our family and friends should be a top priority but when that keeps us from sharing our abundant goods and gifts with others I believe

we’re missing the point of Jesus’ message. Since we’ve all been given different gifts we’re meant to share them with our community. As St. Paul tells us in his first letter to the Corinthians “there are many gifts but the same spirit” using our gifts wisely enhances the lives of all who come within our purview. If we all had the same gifts it would be a very strange world. If everyone had the gift of service whom would they serve? It would be the same if everyone in our community were given the gifts required by a dentist; who then would fix our plumbing?

It’s easy to look at others and compare what we feel are our poor gifts to those whose gifts seem so much more important or useful than those we possess. That just isn’t true. Let’s not allow ourselves to refrain from using our gifts because we think they’re just not worthy. These gifts are God-given and we need to use them to build a world of justice and peace for all; a world where no one lives in fear. As Jesus tells us we need to be prepared – prepared to answer our call to serve others and by doing so serve Him.

Soon we will see the animals preparing for the coming of winter. They will gather food to feed themselves during the cold months ahead. They will grow thicker coats of fur and so be able to protect themselves against the chill winds and bitter temperatures. We too will make preparations for the coming winter; we put away our light clothing and take our woolens and warm jackets; we’ll get our preparations done as we preserve the goods from our gardens to be enjoyed over the cold months ahead. But let’s take some lessons from the little critters that share our environment and be prepared – not just for the coming winter but for that glorious coming of the Lord. We do not know when that will be but we can be assured that it is coming. So like the servants in the gospel let’s be awake and ready to welcome Him when He comes.
