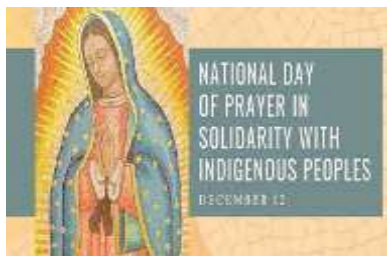

NATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER IN SOLIDARITY WITH INDIGENOUS PEOPLES

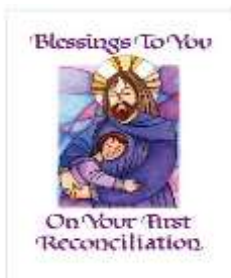

RORATE MASS

Schola Chant Choir



Come join the Sacred Heart Schola Chant Choir for the Rorate Mass on Saturday, December 17th at 9:30 am. This is a candle lit service that gets its proper name from the [first word](#) of the [Introit](#) (Entrance antiphon): "Rorate caeli desuper et nubes pluant justum" ("Drop down dew, ye heavens, from above, and let the clouds rain the just"). The Rorate Mass is a Votive Mass in honor of the Virgin Mary for the season of Advent. It has a long tradition in the Catholic Church. The Masses had to begin relatively early in the morning when it was still dark due to winter-time and were said by candlelight. The Rorate Mass originated during the course of the Middle Ages as one of the various popular Advent devotions to the Blessed Virgin Mary which were then developed. As one of the themes of Advent is the Incarnation of Jesus Christ, the emergence of these devotions to the Blessed Virgin was natural. The Rorate Mass, in particular, was a favorite of the people.
