ASH WEDNESDAY

marks the beginning of Lent. Ashes are used as a sign of our sorrow for having turned away from God; they are placed on our forehead

in the sign of the cross and we keep them until they wear off. However, due Covid restrictions, ashes will be sprinkled on the head instead of the cross on the forehead. The ashes are often produced by burning palms from the previous year's Passion (Palm) Sunday celebration.

Ash Wednesday is not a Holy Day of Obligation for Roman Catholics yet receiving ashes is a universal practice among Christians to begin their Lenten journeys.

“The cross of ashes means that we are making a commitment – that we are undertaking Lent as a season of prayer and penitence, of dying to ourselves. It also describes our human condition: it says that we are broken and need repair; that we are sinners and need redemption. Most importantly, it tells us that, as followers of Jesus Christ, we are to carry our crosses.: Fr. Antony Kadavil (Hallow)

ALL ABOUT Fasting & Abstinence

What is FASTING?
The limitation of food and drink – typically to one main meal and two smaller meals, with no solid foods in between
But remember to drink enough fluids!

What is ABSTINENCE?
Avoiding certain kinds of food or drink, typically meat or other desirable foods

When do we fast?
Ash Wednesday & Good Friday*

When do we abstain?
Catholics are obliged to abstain from meat every Friday throughout the year (except solemn feast days)

*Pascal Fast: Good Friday and Holy Saturday are days of prayer and quiet reflection. We honour the suffering and death of Jesus and prepare to share in the joy of his resurrection at Easter

TIP: Instead of abstaining, you may substitute special acts of charity or piety on Fridays

Why fast?
It helps us to pray better: an empty stomach can lead to more attentive prayer

Why abstain on Fridays?
It's the day of Christ's saving death on the cross; we abstain to share in His work of saving the world

Who has to fast?
Catholics aged 18 to 60
Those with impaired health should not fast in any way.

Who has to abstain?
Catholics aged 14 and older

During Lent, the money we save on food while fasting and abstaining should be given to others in alms

The 8th Sunday in Ordinary Time –
Some Musings

“... for each tree is known by its own fruit”

The trees behind me are barren; no green leaves or fruit of any kind to feed the little creature with whom I share this planet. These trees will soon be lush with greenery, some will be abundant with nuts and fruit of all sorts to serve the needs of all. While this is food for the soul it certainly won't feed us. We share this earth with many different species: we need to be

aware of our responsibility to share of our abundance. As stewards of God's earth it is our duty to work hand in hand with Him. I think that's why Jesus uses so many parables about this earth and our role in it. The teachings of Jesus are not difficult to comprehend. We're told to love our enemies, to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, give drink to the thirsty. We're not meant to be hoarders of our gifts but use them wisely to continue His work here and now.

At times these teachings are hard to follow but if we expect to live as He would want us to live; giving of our abundance and blessings to ease the pain and sorrows of our sisters and brothers. We're meant to be kind to others and not cause them to stumble and fall. We're meant to watch carefully for those opportunities to be His messengers. We're meant to see clearly when an opportunity comes our way. We obviously can't do that if there is log in our eye. Now Jesus does not mean that we literally have a log in our eye but our blindness to the needs of others is just that – a great log that prevents us from recognizing those opportunities when they come.

Jesus does not mean that we are really walking about with logs sticking out of our eyes but if we ignore the needs of others we may just have that kind of malady when we fail to see those needs of our companions. So we should ask ourselves what prevents us from seeing the needs of others when they are so visible. If we do that what good is having 20/20 vision? When Jesus speaks in parables He is not posing a riddle to be solved but a simple illustration of how we are meant to behave toward Him and others.

Next week we begin our Lenten journey toward the great feast of Easter. This year let's not give something up but rather commit our minds and hearts to bear that good fruit He speaks of, watching for those chances to be good stewards of this earth and caring for our sisters and brothers and to walk with Jesus and others along the road to salvation, peace and hope. Let's not grow weary of doing good here and keeping to His laws and precepts not out of a sense of duty but out of love and hope because doing good out of duty, while it yields a good deed done is not as rich an offering as one done out of love for our Lord and others.
