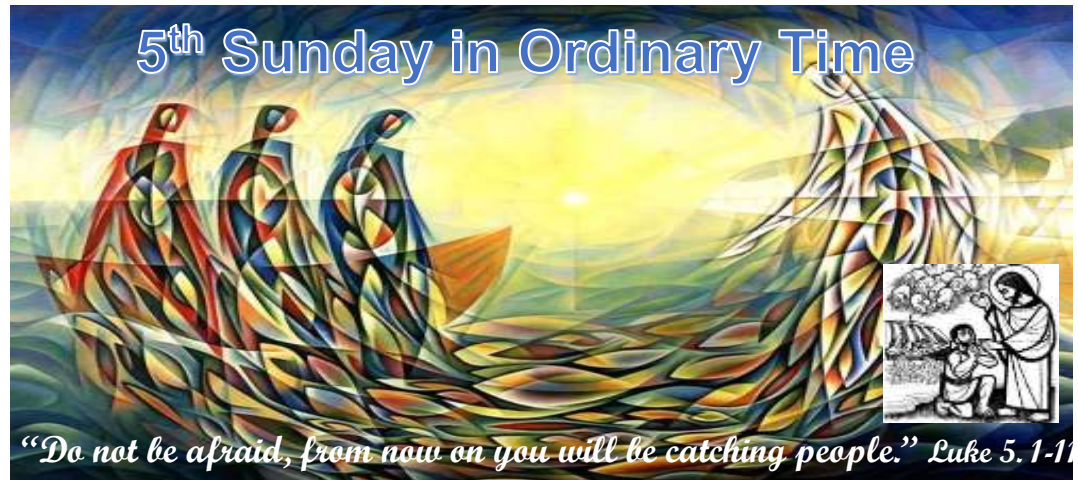

- the date you would like this Mass to be celebrated.

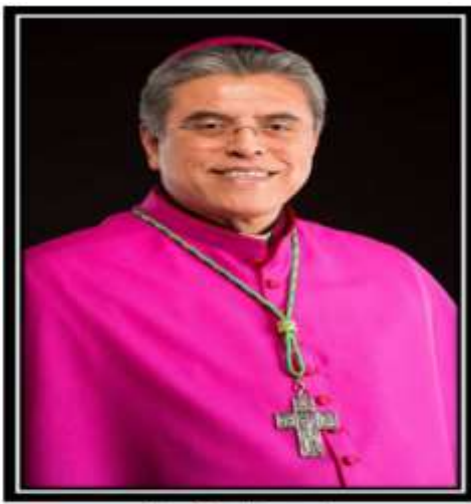


World Day of the Sick – Feb. 11

MUSINGS

The 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time – Some Musings

“Go away from me Lord, for I am a sinful man.”

It's been a long day. They've fished and have nothing to show for it. I suppose that's why it's called 'fishing' and not 'catching'. They are tired and hungry and the nets still have to be cleaned and mended. The sun has sapped their energy and the sun has burned their skin. They want the comfort of home and family but suddenly along comes this fellow telling them to give it one more try. Really! They must think. He certainly doesn't look like someone who knows a great deal about their lives. Still, there's something about him that makes them believe him; so perhaps against their better judgment, they give it one more try and lo and behold they have a marvelous catch. Now they can go home

satisfied that their day has not been wasted. As they prepare to go this man asks something else. "Come! Follow me." And again they go. I'm sure we've all had days like this. We've worked hard and long and the results have been less than we hoped.

I recall a time when I was marking papers well into the wee hours and while I knew I had taught the material, the essays proved that to be a thankless job. Ready to give up and go to bed, I decided to mark one more paper meaning that I'd be nearly finished. The paper was well-written, well-argued with few grammatical or spelling errors. It pays to stick to a task until it is complete.

Had those tired and sweaty fishermen not done as Jesus had asked, I wonder where we'd be. Sometimes, when the task seems too difficult, too onerous, too beyond what we see as our capabilities, we need to trust in the Lord, knowing that He will be there to strengthen and sustain us. If the Lord asks us to follow His will, it is not because we are more suited to the job than someone else but that He wants us to know that whatever we think we are able to do may not be what He knows we can. We, like the fishermen, may not know what the future holds for us, but if we, like them, trust that He will be with us we tackle the task with the knowledge that He will walk with us.

Surely those fishermen didn't look like the stuff that martyrs are made of. They were folks like you and me, trying to make a living and minding their own business. Yet when Jesus calls, they answer, not it seems with trepidation but with confidence for they had seen Him do things that they'd never seen before. If we look around us we, too, will see the wondrous things He's done for us.

Sit quietly and reflect on all the wonders that He's done. We have a beautiful world with so many moments that give us joy, or peace, or hope. I have a fat little grey squirrel that visits me from time to time. I can walk up to my patio door, he looks at me, puts his tiny front paws on my door and we have a quiet visit in the sun. We all can recount moments like this that gave us joy. We have friends who call or visit; we have families that are precious to us whether they are near or far. Unlike many in our world we are free to worship, to speak our truth – provided of course that we speak it with kindness.

When we hear His call to service, let's emulate those simple fishermen and answer with joy, hope, and confidence in His power to strengthen and hold us close as we go about His work. Like those early fishermen, we have been called. Our mission? To follow our Lord, loving Him and one another, and staying true to His teaching and rejoicing in His service.

In this time of pandemic we can become disillusioned and feel hopeless at times. When that happens we need to turn to Him, ask His guidance and become His messengers of peace and hope by reaching out to others.
