



OUR LADY OF THE CAPE PILGRIM STATUE TOUR

Most Rev. Héctor Vila is pleased to announce the visit of Our Lady of the Cape to the Diocese of Whitehorse. This three-week pilgrim statue tour will take place at the end of the summer from **August 26th to September 16th, 2022**. This year marks the 75th Anniversary of the Consecration of Canada to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. These Marian tours are happening this year in various dioceses across Canada to provide opportunities to venerate Canada's National Madonna and to promote the on-going consecration to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The last time the statue visited our diocese was in 1953. Once again, we are blessed to have this occasion for renewal, healing and unity within our diocese through the intercession of our Blessed Mother Mary. Some events will begin in mid-August with public screenings of the film *Bridge of Roses: The Story of Our Lady of the Cape* in each parish and mission. This will be followed by activities in individual communities throughout our diocese, in the Catholic schools in Whitehorse, and other locations. **The statue will be here at SHC on August 26-28, 2022.** Check the Diocese of Whitehorse website, and church websites and bulletin announcements for details as the date approaches. 
Seek God in your need, and let your hearts revive.

The 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time - Some Musings

"Who is my neighbour?"

We need rain. The grass, which so recently, was a lush green is looking scorched and dry. The skies are sunny and the temperatures comfortable but we need rain. Our farming neighbours tell the same story, we need rain. I recall a time long ago when the Calgary Stampede board decided to charge the native population an entrance fee to the Stampede grounds. Previously they had been given free access as they set up their native villages for attendees to visit free of charge. There were native dances and songs; and many of the crafts no longer used in daily life were there and a member of the tribe would describe how it was made and what its use was. It was always fun to visit those native villages. On the year in question, all the tribes came together and did a "Rain Dance". Now whether it was a coincidence or not it rained the entire week. It NEVER rained during Stampede Week. The following year, the native peoples were again given free access to set up their villages. But I've heard it said that there are only two seasons in Calgary - winter and Stampede Week. And we do need rain. Whether that Rain Dance got the desired result or not it was still not a neighbourly thing to do. We need to do the neighbourly thing and pray for our farming neighbours and ask that a gentle four day rain blesses their crops. "Who is my neighbour?" In the family of the Church we are more than neighbours - we are family and as such we need to love others with that familial love that we see demonstrated in the lives of good families.

The story of the Good Samaritan gives us the answer to that question. Our neighbours are those who need our assistance on their journey through life. I am blessed with good neighbours; people on whom I know I can call if I need assistance in anything. There is a couple in my neighbourhood who, during the summer, keep my larder full of fresh vegetables. These may not seem like a huge things to some but this couple blesses my life in ways beyond thanks. Our world would be a very different, a very happier place, were it filled with people like these - people who are generous with their time and those who come to us when we are in need.

A neighbour is not always someone we know; good neighbours come in all circumstances of life. They're the ones who take items off the upper shelves at the grocery store when we can't reach them; the ones who stoop to pick up items when we drop them; those who smile as they wait patiently behind someone moving slowly in a store. If we broaden our thinking we can see neighbours throughout our day. Let's be more aware of those people and be the good neighbours that our Lord asks us to be. And let's not forget to say "Thank you".

We are never told that the person on the receiving end of the Samaritan's help ever had the opportunity to thank him but that's not really the point of this parable. The point is that a perfect stranger and one from a group that was not friendly to the Jewish people, stopped to help when all others failed to do so. We need to be good neighbours to all we meet in our daily lives. I recall a time when I was standing at the checkout counter with a cart full of grocery. The gentleman ahead of me who had just finished paying for his grocery order, turned and asked, "Could I help you unload your cart". I am not very tall and reaching over the cart was a struggle and I thankfully accepted his offer. As he finished unloading my cart I simply said, "God bless you sir." To which he replied, "Why thank you." I've never seen that fellow again but that one act of kindness from a stranger has remained with me. Let's not ask, "Who is my neighbour?" but treat others with the kindness that they deserve as children of a loving God.
