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### The 27<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time – Some Musings

*“for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs.”*

The dawn broke on a sunny day even though the temperatures were cooler. The sky had lost that brilliant blue of summer and it was easy to feel the coming of autumn in the breeze. I watched rabbits scurry around, squirrels storing up nuts for the coming winter. There didn't seem to be a great rush to get that done but one knew that fall with its brilliant leaves and cooler temperatures was finally here. The days are getting shorter as the sun sets earlier each day. As I watched the late afternoon panorama unfold before me, a pair of Canada Geese were taking a late afternoon stroll across my backyard. These birds, like so many other species, mate for life. Swans, Atlantic Puffins, even coyotes, bald eagles and many monkey species choose a mate and stay with it through thick and thin. So many species in the natural world do that. It is what God intended for His people as well.

Now we know that there are some marriages that should never be. In cases of abuse, one cannot expect the abused party to stay in that relationship so our Church sets in place a means for people to re-marry in those circumstances. But it is not the norm. I remember when I was getting married, my Dad took the two of us aside and told us, “Marriage is not a 50-50

proposition. It's 100% on both sides." It was very good advice and stood us in good stead throughout our marriage. Marriage is not easy and it takes work from both partners. We live in a society that does not seem to value things that last. Things are more cheaply made and are disposed of when we grow tired of them. The media tells us that we must change the décor of our homes with the changing of the seasons. This type of thinking does not bode well for marriages. It seems that when we grow tired of our partner, we should be rid of him or her. With all the help that is available to us, we should try every avenue of that help before throwing in the towel.

God has meant us to be happy but I've discovered that happiness, like so many other emotions, is a decision. We may be angry with our partner, but that does not mean we should just give up trying. My husband had a wry sense of humour which usually made me laugh. I recall a time when we'd been arguing fiercely and I was ready to continue the battle until I got what my way. He came up to me, touched me on the shoulder and said, "Dear, I still choose to love you." That ended the battle then and there. As with most things a good marriage is worth working on but it does take two people willing to give.

The relationship between Christ and His Church is often likened to a marriage and that being the case, I'm glad that He does not choose to divorce us when we are unfaithful, unloving and unappreciative. Thinking about that happening makes me tremble. Were that to occur where would we be? We'd have no place to offer praise and thanks, no sacraments to nourish, strengthen and heal us. So let's pray for those who are struggling in their relationships, supporting when we can and always doing so with love rather than condemnation.

As the sun set the other evening, I saw its last rays brush the tops of the trees and saw again those rabbits hunkering down for the night ahead. They scampered away leaving me feeling blessed to have watched them. As we continue to strive to do His will, let's remember to ask for His help and the assistance and prayers of our faith community to keep us strong in His service.

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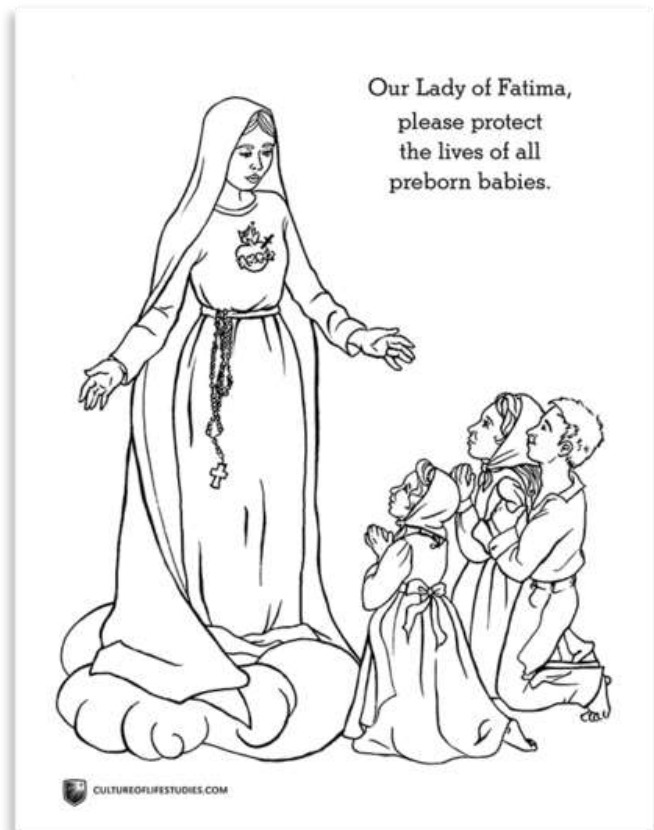
