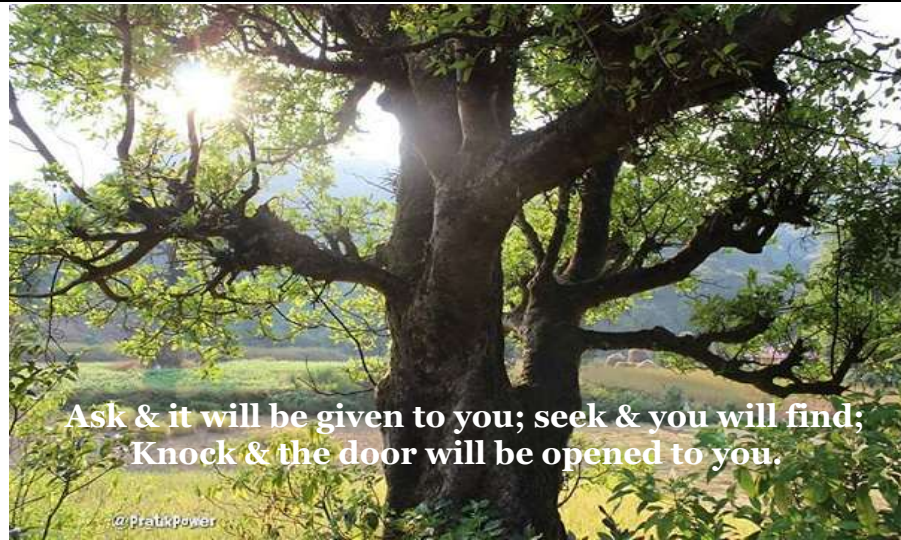

He will return to Whitehorse on July 27 in the afternoon. We welcome your prayers for the Holy Father and for all residential school survivors, chiefs, elders, knowledge keepers and representatives from many of Yukon and Northern British Columbia First Nations who will be attending the papal visit events in Alberta. Let us all pray for reconciliation and healing.

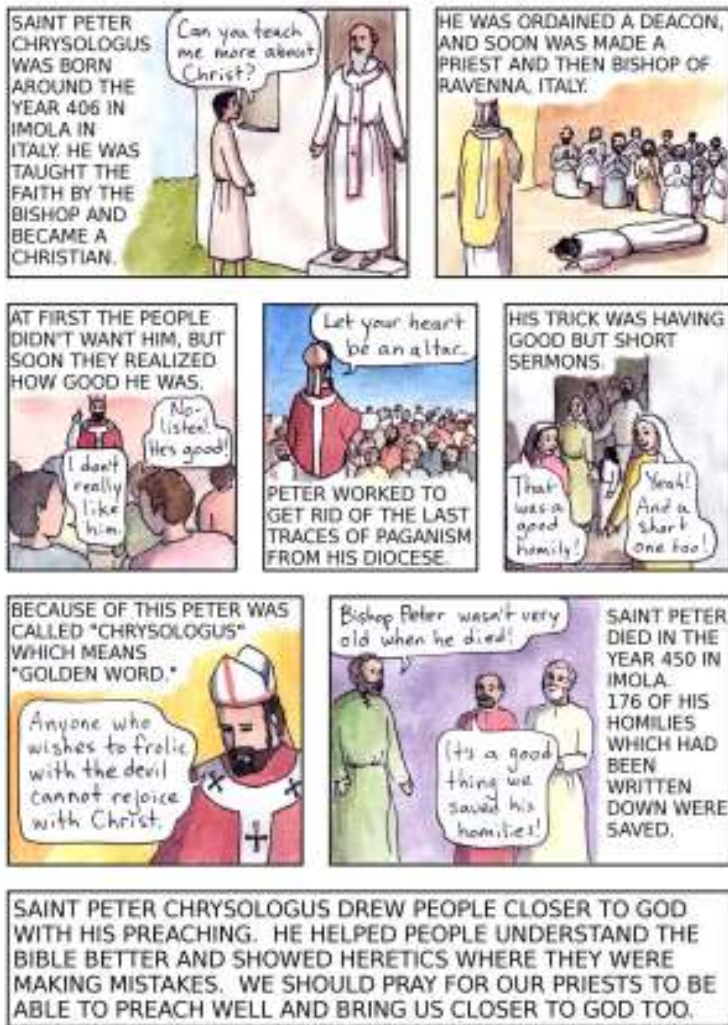

The 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time – Some Musings

"Martha, Martha, you are distracted by many things . . ."

I stood at the window and watched the sky in the quiet of dusk; the sun had just set and the sky was painted with a deep blue streaked with tangerine clouds. The scene was peaceful, the perfect end to a day filled with little tasks that had occupied my time. The phone had been ringing and people had come to the door trying to sell me things I really didn't want or need. In fact, it had been a day like many others; filled with things of this world that keep us busy and occupied. I had sat to pray and the phone rang. I have an answering machine yet I felt compelled to stop and answer that call, taking me away from precious time with my God. I could almost hear His voice admonishing me, "Betty, Betty, you are distracted by many things." It was after all, a call that could have waited.

We need to re-arrange our thinking and do what is truly important and leave all other things to a later date. We need to put our relationship with our heavenly Lord in first place in our lives and not relegate Him to "when we have the time". Let's turn off our technology and spend quiet time with our Saviour. For some of us that is exactly what happened not long ago. Some glitch or other had put a number of people off line with no internet, no television, no phones. Someone asked me how I occupied my time. Well, I grew up with no internet and no television and our phone line was a shared party line. So I was just fine. It was rather pleasant to have that time away from the busyness of life. While our technology can streamline many things it is also a major distraction in our lives. We are rarely away from the noise of the world going on around us.

It's hard to pray in the hubbub of the world and perhaps that's why Jesus gives His disciple a very simple prayer. As

we're told in Matthew's gospel we are not to babble as the pagans do. Our Father knows what we need and if we pray asking for His guidance it will surely come to us. We must also remember that prayer is a dialogue not a monologue and we need some time to sit quietly and listen for His voice in the stillness of our hearts. It is a lesson that Elijah learns in the first book of Kings. We can be so busy talking that we don't take time to listen for His voice. Our God does not try to gain our attention by shouting or railing at us, rather He waits for us to listen to His voice.

The prayer that Jesus teaches us, His disciples, is simple and straightforward and if we listen quietly to the still voice our prayers will be answered in due time. As I examined my own prayer life I realized that frequently I am so busy talking I don't take time to listen. If we were having a conversation with a friend we certainly wouldn't do all the talking, so why, when we're talking with God do we do all the talking? We need to learn as Elijah that the voice of God is heard in the stillness. Let's listen for the sound of silence and thank Him for stilling our hearts to the sound of the world and listen to His gentle voice. Let's shut down the chaos of the world and listen.

The world offers us so much to consider and if we still ourselves for a period of time each day we will find that God speaks to us in those silent moments. Let's not be distracted by so many things that we lose sight of what is important – our relationship with our loving God. Let's, like Mary, Martha's sister, choose that better part.
