The 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time – Some Musings

The story of the mustard seed gives us so much to consider about our Church. What began with twelve apostles has now grown to encompass the entire world. And we need to consider why that is so. Jesus put a great deal of faith in those twelve and empowered them with His spirit to carry out their mission to tell the whole world about His saving help and telling them to baptize in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit. They did as He asked and look what we have now – a Church that ministers to the entire world. Like that mustard bush it is a shelter for many and a help to all who ask in faith. And these men and women didn't have the benefits we have today.

When they travelled from one place to another doing the will of Jesus, they went on foot or on horseback or on the back of a camel. They didn't have the internet to assist them in spreading the word: They stood in the market squares and wherever they found people in need of the joyful news. They didn't pick and choose the audience; they knew that the whole world was in desperate need of that message of hope. Why is it then, that with all our technology and conveniences we don't have the same zealotry as those early disciples? I think perhaps, it's because we *have* all that technology at our disposal and we rely on it to do our evangelizing for us. We tend to rely on those devices or others, missionaries, priests and deacons members of religious orders, commissioned to preach to others that we fail in our role as disciples.

If we all, everyone of us who call ourselves Christians, spread the good news of salvation this world would be a far different place. Yes, we'd still have illnesses, temptations and sin, but there would be so many more ways to ward off the despair that can hold people captive. Perhaps too, we lack the zealotry of those early disciples. We tell ourselves that they were enflamed by the Holy Spirit, forgetting that we have had those same gifts bestowed on us at our own Confirmation.

Or we can rely on the fact that if we live our lives as good Christians people will see our good works and our joy and want to emulate us. While this is certainly a valid belief it is rarely enough when someone disagrees us and we fail to respond with kindness and knowledge of the Lord's teachings. While St. Francis once said, "Preach the gospel always; when necessary use words" sometimes those words are necessary and if we're not prepared to proclaim our faith, we are very poor followers of our Lord and Saviour. As we live this wonderful and blessed time we call "Ordinary" let's make it anything but that. Let's work to proclaim the gospel, to live lives that demonstrate our love of God and neighbour, and carry out the spiritual and corporal works of mercy. When we see a glorious sunset or sunrise, when the song of a bird lifts our spirits, let's thank Him with devotion and love.
