



The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ – Some Musings

“You give them something to eat.”

I opened my windows and let in the smell of rain-washed earth. It’s one of the spring scents that give me a sense of the rejuvenation that is the essence of spring. Farmers are out in their fields; it’s a time of growth and soon we’ll be into those “Lazy, hazy, crazy days of summer” as we wait for the harvest to ripen, the hay to be cut. We wait for the produce of the land to feed us. I’ve watched animals both wild and tame as they feed and take care of their young ones. Feeding the hungry is one of the corporal works of mercy; those works that meet our bodily needs. As I read this familiar gospel story, I knew that while Jesus met those needs of His followers, I also knew that the crowd would go away and be hungry again.

We were not present at that miracle and so have not been fed with those five loaves and two fish but we have been fed by His loving mercy when we eat His Body and drink His Blood. And as He told the Samaritan woman at the well, His food is food that will last us throughout our life time. How often we go to receive His Body and Blood with little or no preparation; we advance and receive Him, then go back to our seats and pick up the conversation we were having with our friends and neighbours. We need to think about how we receive our Lord. His is not just food for the body, it’s food for the soul and as such we need to accept it reverently and with great thanks and devotion. Those moments after we’ve received Him in the form of bread and wine need to be spent in praise and worship, with thanksgiving and praise.

That Food strengthens us to do as Jesus commands His disciples, “You give them something to eat.” It’s a call to serve our sisters and brothers with a generous spirit, not grudgingly as we sometimes do when called to serve others. It can be a difficult thing to keep our minds focused on our prayers and devotions; it takes discipline and perseverance. When we are surrounded by distractions it becomes even more difficult. But if we want a closer relationship with our God, we need to find ways to do just that.

God knows our weaknesses absolutely but He also wants to help us in our attempts to become the people He has called His own – that nation set apart, that royal priesthood and His children. Just as we forgive the weaknesses of our own children, so our Father forgives us. As we endeavour to become His disciples, feeding His hungry, clothing His naked, giving drink to His thirsty we do it to Him. As we continue our journey through Ordinary Time, let’s choose two or three areas of our faith life that we know are not where they should be and work to improve those areas. Let’s truly become the people who will “give them something to eat.”
