HAPPY FATHER'S DAY!

The 12th Sunday in Ordinary Time – Some Musings

“Peace! Be still!”

The peace of a quiet mid-afternoon was disrupted by the roll of thunder and a sudden downpour of pelting rain. The sky had gone from a brilliant blue to gloomy grey. Mayhem all around as anything lying loose blew away on the heavy wind. I was reminded of a time when my husband and I had taken our small sailboat to Lake Huron on a sunny Saturday. We were enjoying a good wind and a brisk sail when suddenly we spotted a storm coming swiftly across the water toward us. We headed for shore. In those few anxious moments, we had wished for someone to say, “Peace! Be still!” In times of trouble and turmoil, isn’t that what we want? Someone to come to our aid and calm our troubled spirits. We can forget that the words in Scripture are meant for us every bit as much as they were meant for the people at the time they were written. We need to know that our God is present to us just as He was present to the people of ancient times. He is timeless and all-knowing, present in the world if we are aware of Him in His creation, in His people and in our souls. I believe that we think God no longer performs miracles because we’re looking for tremendous events and stunning happenings so we miss all those wonderful small miracles that occur in our lives every day. I have always believed that just as Elijah was waiting for a miracle and not finding it in the fierce wind, the earthquake or the fire, but in the gentle whispering of the breeze, we miss those miracles because we’re looking for the wrong things. Our Lord does not “smack us up the side of the head” to get our attention but rather, speaks to us in the small and simple things that we all too regularly take for granted.

We miss His gentle voice as the Spirit blows through the trees, rustling leaves: We miss His voice in the song of birds and frogs. He’s there, and we miss Him. We need to open our ears and eyes so we don’t miss those times when the Lord comes into our lives in the guise of friends and neighbours who assist us in both large and small ways. Let’s not miss Him but rather be aware of His presence in our world. His words to us, “I am with you until the end of the age” need to reverberate in our souls making us cognisant of His presence in our daily lives.

Our world can be full of trials and tribulations but knowing that the Lord walks with us can ease the trouble that can surround us. Let’s not let the turbulence in our world disrupt our peace but let’s let the Lord be in our minds so we can hear those wonderful words, “Be still! And know that I am God!”
