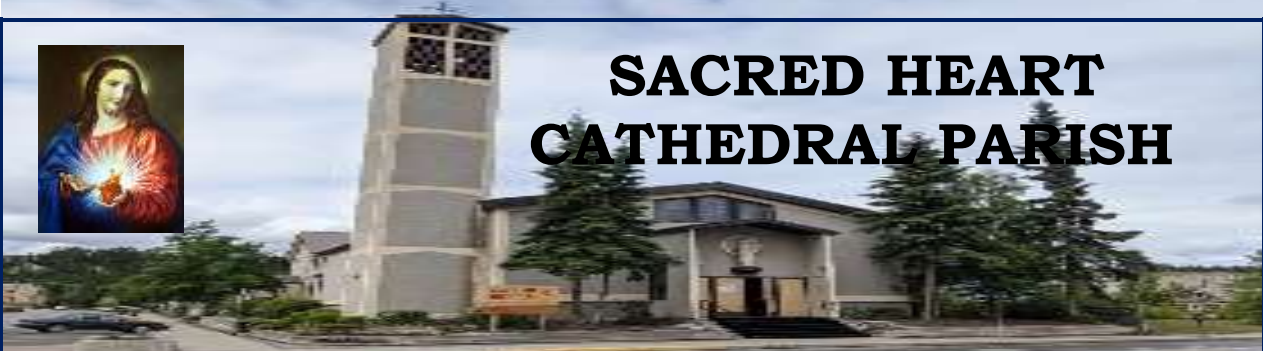

*Excerpt from the Homily of Fr. Freison Kunumpurathu Thomas
23 June 2024, Sacred Heart Cathedral, Whitehorse, YT, Ca.*

In today's readings, it is a call for us to a deeper trust in God's power and wisdom, to embrace the transformation offered through Christ, and to maintain faith in His presence and peace amidst life's challenges. They remind us that, despite our limitations and the storms we face, God's sovereignty and love are constant and dependable. Our response should be one of humility, faith, and a commitment to living out the new life we have in Christ.

As God reminded Job, if God can create and order the universe out of nothing, then God can bring order and good to our lives too. He wants to save us after all. The boat in today's Gospel eventually reached/ safe and sound to the other side. Why? Because Jesus was in the boat! He is with us too. Have faith. Paul's says, The love of Christ is a driving force that changes everything. To embrace the new life given to us through His sacrifice. It encourages us to see others through the lens of Christ's love, fostering reconciliation and unity.

It reassures that Jesus is sovereign over all life's storms and invites each one of us to trust Him deeply. It challenges us to examine our own faith and response to fear. Are we like the disciples, doubting and fearful, or can we rest in the knowledge of Christ's presence and power?
