The 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time – Some Musings

“Daughter, your faith has made you well.”

The day is hot and humid, damp and dreary. But we know the sun will shine and bring growth and bounty to our earth. We have faith that this is so. Yet it can be difficult to believe that our prayers, like those of Jarius and the woman in the gospel story today are heard and answered. It seems strange that we believe in so many things of the natural world, a world created and redeemed by our loving God, but have difficulty believing He will come to our aid when we pray. It seems we don't even have faith the size of the mustard seed. We are told to ask in faith, and our prayers will be answered, but as Hamlet would say, “Aye! There's there rub!” We don't always ask in faith.

I'm not sure whether that's because we ask only in hope rather than faith or that we ask for the wrong things. Sometimes we ask that pain be taken away or that our parents will be healed or that our lives be made easier rather than asking for the strength or the wisdom to solve a sticky problem. If we did that I'm sure our prayers would be answered.

When we don't really believe that our Lord answers prayers even when we get an answer we deny that it came from the Lord. We have a great deal of faith in our own ability to solve problems that when we get an answer, particularly one we don't like, that it certainly can't come from Him.

I recall a time when I was struggling to find an answer to my prayer and I had prayed long and hard for an answer. Finally, in desperation, I said, “Lord why do you remain silent. I've asked over and over that this prayer be answered.” Then in the depth of my very being I heard Him say, “Then stop talking and listen!” We can spend so much time talking that hearing the Lord's voice becomes next to impossible. Ours is a noise-some world. There's sound all around us. We want to sit quietly in prayer and our thoughts are interrupted by sirens, car horns, construction sounds and the sounds of loud music blasting somewhere in the distance and these can so easily take our minds off our prayer. It's hard to find a quiet time to sit in reflective prayer, to go to a quiet corner in our hearts to praise and worship, to ask and then listen for His answers.

We are in this lovely, long stretch of our Liturgical year that we call Ordinary Time. It's a time to take the ordinary events in our lives and turn them into a time of worship. I really believe that if we knew how to look at life, all life would become a prayer. We need to become aware of those wonders that go unnoticed in our own ordinary time and in that awareness give Him the glory He is due. I believe that by doing so we can develop a faith the size of that mustard seed and thereby transform our faith life into something rich and exuberant.


LET'S KEEP IN OUR PRAYERS:
