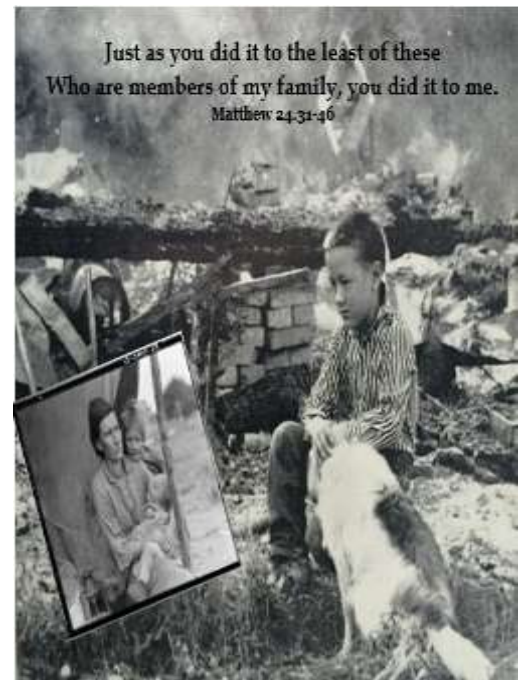
Be with me, Lord, when I am in trouble

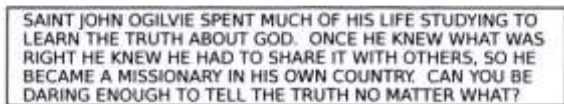
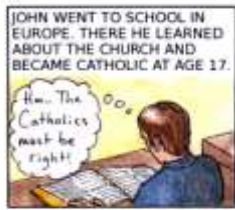
When making donation, people must indicate on the dropdown menu which country they want the money will be allotted to.

The 1st Sunday in Lent - Some Musings

"Worship the Lord your God and serve only Him."

The icy fingers of winter still search for any exposed skin and noses, our fingers, or toes feel its effects. We are into the month of March when spring is supposed to bring warming breezes and milder temperatures. I always wonder why the shortest month seems so terribly long. Those twenty-eight days can seem like forty to me. And I think of Jesus being tempted in the wilderness. His strength has been sapped by the unrelenting sun, He is hungry and His mouth is dry as dry. His defenses are down and along comes the great Tempter offering solace and help. But our Lord does not break down but fends Satan off with rebukes.

Satan chooses the time when we are the most vulnerable to his words. We are hungry, standing in the checkout line and that chocolate bar looks so good. No one is looking, we could easily slip it into a pocket with no one the wiser. What is our choice? The devil is sly and cunning; watching for any opportunity to lead us astray and separate us from the loving care of our Father and Saviour. He wants an army of miscreants at his beck and call and we have to choose - will we remain true to our baptismal and confirmation promises and lead the life He would have us do or do we break down and follow the wrong path. Will Satan do as He did with Jesus? "And leave us until an opportune time." Even though Jesus is hungry and thirsty and His defenses are down, He still is able to defray the urgings of the devil. That opportune time comes when He is in the Garden of Gethsemane, alone, knowing that He is to face the trial of His life.

We have no idea how we will be tempted so we need to ensure that our own defenses are strong, rooted in the words of a loving God and Saviour. We

need to be ready at all times because we have no idea when the devil will come with his convincing words and lies to draw us away - to lead us astray. And once we are lead away he does all he can to make sure we don't go back. Our temptations like those of Jesus are rooted in our physical being. Food of all sorts when we are hungry: drink when we are parched: power over others. Yes, our physical needs are there, but as thinking beings we're meant to use our wills to have control over them all.

During this pandemic it's been difficult to maintain some semblance of control. We're told where we can go, what we're to wear and how far apart we are to stand to keep us safe from this virus. We are not told however, how to behave toward one another, how we're meant to treat others. That information comes from our God and we'd best abide by it if we're to be safe from the snares and traps that Satan sets for us.

We need to be on our guard against Satan's wiles for he is extremely wily and cunning and our human nature, left on its own is too weak often to resist. Let's be vigilant and strong, putting our trust in God. But as my Dad used to say, "Put your trust in God but keep your gunpowder dry!" We have to do our part if we are to be His disciples in this world. It is here after all that we work out our salvation "in fear and trembling."

As the days lengthen and the sun warms let's like spring be ready to put on fresh garments of love and service and do our best to be the kind of people He needs - people who will work tirelessly and well, people with joyful hearts and peaceful spirits.
