

Registration forms are available on our website and at the entrance of the church. Catechesis for First Reconciliation starts on **Oct. 12 @ 6:30 pm** at the rectory. Catechesis for Confirmation starts on **Oct. 20** at 6:30 pm at the CYO hall.



CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD: CGS is a program of Christian formation for the children based on the teaching methods of Maria Montessori and drawing on the most essential element of scripture and liturgy. CGS helps children to name, explore and deepen their relationship with God as the foundation of their lives. In CGS, the classroom, called atrium, is a spiritual environment – a place of worship rather than a traditional classroom. It is a place of work that becomes prayer and conversation with God. We are pleased to again be offering Level One this year. Level One is for children 3 to 5 years old (preschool to kindergarten). The program starts on **Oct. 16** and will run every Saturday morning from 10:30 to noon. Our atrium is located in the lower level of the rectory. The 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time – Some Musings

“... for God all things are possible.”

The sun seems to have hidden itself under a blanket of clouds. These clouds have sent rain to nourish the earth, to prepare it for the coming of winter when things will be wrapped in a blanket of snow and ice. It’s a day to stay indoors and sit quietly with a good book and a cup of hot tea. Feeling in need of that warmth, I decided to have a cup of hot chocolate, tasty and sweet in its warmth. I am blessed with many good things in my life, the love of family and friends, the warmth of a comfortable home, the joys of freedom to do so many things. On this Thanksgiving weekend, I have so many things for which to praise and thank God. Selling all these things, leaving my family and friends would be so terribly hard. Is that what it takes to become a true disciple of the Lord? Certainly leaving family and friends would tear at my heart. But I believe our Lord, in this very difficult gospel is telling us that we’re not to become so attached to these things that we forget our call to love our neighbours, to share the goods we have to alleviate some of the suffering that so many in our own community face.

It’s easy to become a slave to things we have in our lives. Rather than sharing of our blessings we can often cling to them tightly, to do all in our power to increase our goods and to ensure that we don’t lose them. There’s a lovely song by country singer, Alan Jackson, called “The Older I Get” and one of the verses says, “The older I get, the truer it is, it’s the people you love, not the money and stuff that makes you rich”. And I’ve found that so true as the older I get. I think many of us have found that to be the case during this pandemic. Not being able to get together with loved ones, to hold them close puts a strain our hearts. So leaving all these things behind is a tough call. Yet I believe that our Lord doesn’t expect us all to sell everything and join the ranks of the impoverished. We’d be unable to assist others, to use our goods for the good of struggling members of our community. If we want to be His true disciples, we need to take a good and a hard look at how we use the goods we have. We need to ensure that we distribute some of our goods to support our parish, to support other causes that are worthy and close to our heart. It’s not enough to talk about what we should do but quietly work to do what we can to assist others in their needs. As St. James tells us, “Faith without good works is dead.”

There is much to be said for a disciplined spirit; one that is willing to take the harder course and do what the Lord asks of us. Not only do we aid those in need, we do our Savior’s work here in this time. This Thanksgiving let’s do a tally of our blessings and with an open mind and willing spirit, let’s ask ourselves what we can do to be His disciples, disciples who are not slaves to our possessions but are willing to share our abundance with those in need and want.




How can we make sure human rights are respected and environmental harm avoided as we improve our global and national climate policies?


