

The 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time – Some Musings

“Whoever is not against us is for us.”

The readings for this weekend remind us to avoid the near occasions of sin; those times and places that tempt us and that we find hard to overcome. I’m sure the Lord does not want us maim ourselves but He does want us to steel ourselves for those times. We can so easily fall into that trap of temptation that leads us to sin against our Lord or others. Try as we might there are times when temptation just seems too strong for us. I’ve often said that the devil is so devious in his ways. He doesn’t come to us in a form we recognize as evil: rather he comes disguised in a form we see as exactly what we need. I used to tell my kids that the devil comes to us in the form of an O’Henry chocolate bar when we’re very hungry and don’t have quite enough cash in our jeans to pay for it, so stealing it seems the perfect solution. We know that’s not true but . . . You understand.

We strike out in anger at others; we shout out our frustrations; we find ourselves doing things we know to be wrong but our weak human nature is hard to overcome. It’s why we’re so blessed to have the sacrament of reconciliation or our spiritual advisors to help us conquer these weaknesses.

I often find myself struggling against the same temptation over and over and it’s at times like that I go to my spiritual advisor for assistance. Talking things over can help me find ways to overcome these weaknesses and give me a greater sense of peace and harmony.

I look at the world around me and see the harmony and peace I find there. It’s a peace that no one on earth can bestow. It is given by our loving Lord. It’s a peace that comes from Him and He alone can give it. When we ask for His help in times of temptation, we’d best see it when it comes and cling to it to aid us in our struggle. Our Lord never leaves us to our own devices when we ask for His help but we must be open to that help when it comes. I recall at time sitting Mass. I was finding it difficult to stay focused on my prayers and on the Mass itself. I had been praying before the Mass started asking God to help me stay attentive during these prayers and during the Mass. I was so busy talking to my Lord, so focused on this prayer. Suddenly, or so it seemed at the time, I heard the Lord say to me, “Just stop talking and listen!” I awoke the other morning to a day filled with fog, a fog so thick that it was well-nigh impossible to see the trees behind me. It was early and it appeared that we were in for a day of cloud and rain. As I gazed at that fog, I thought how like it was to St. Paul in his letter to the Corinthians, “We see now as through a glass darkly.” We cannot possibly understand with our weak human nature, all that the Lord would teach us. We need the help of the Church and its holy men and women to come to an understanding of what God wants from us. Let’s make sure we listen attentively to the words proclaimed at Mass and the teaching in the homilies of our priests and deacons. And let’s be open to those wonderful and awe-inspiring “AhHa moments when they come.
