I. SEPTEMBER 01: WORLD DAY OF PRAYER FOR THE CARE OF CREATION

IN 2015, Pope Francis declared September 01 as the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation. Coinciding with a celebration instituted by the Orthodox Church, it is also a day of ecumenical prayer and unity. Let us reflect on the theme “Fostering a Prophetic Ecological Imagination” and may we find a deeper meaning of our great role as “Responsible Stewards of Nature”.

II. SIGNIFICANT UPDATES ON SACRAMENTAL PREPARATIONS

A. First Communion/Reconciliation and Confirmation

Registration is now open for our Sacramental Preparation classes and the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program. All classes start at the beginning of October and are held in the rectory. Registration forms are available in the entrance of the church, the parish office and on our website.

B. First Reconciliation & First Communion

C. Confirmation

Grade 7, 8 & 9 Students, Sundays 6:30 to 8:00 pm, First class October 6

III. Good Shepherd Catechesis

Good Shepherd Catechesis is a great program helping little children to know God and to fall in love with Jesus. It is divided into two levels, and the second one is offered to the children that have completed the first level. Registration forms are available in the entrance of the church, the parish office and on our website.

Level 1 Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

For children ages 3, 4 & 5 years old (kindergarten)
Saturdays 10:00 to 11:30 am, First class October 5

Level 2 Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

For children ages 6, 7, 8 & 9 (children must have participated in level 1)
Wednesdays 3:30 to 5:00 pm, First class October 2

IV. RITES OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION FOR ADULTS (RCIA)

Our RCIA program is offered for those who

- Are not baptized Christians and who would like to become Catholics
- Those who are baptized as other Christian religions (Anglican, United etc.) who would like to join the Catholic Church
- Catholics who are coming back to the Church after long time, especially for those who have never been confirmed
- Anyone else who feel their knowledge of Catholic faith is inadequate

The classes will take place once a week starting in October and the program will run till end of April. Dates and times of classes are to be determined. Registration forms are available in the entrance of the church, the parish office and on our website.

V. THE NICENE CREED

Every 25 years a Jubilee year is proclaimed by the Pope. It happens that our very next year 2025 will be declared a Holy Year with Hope being a main theme. It also happens that Jubilee Year will also coincided with 1700th anniversary of the first great Ecumenical Council, that of Nicea. One of the initiatives to remember this milestone in the Church history is to proclaim Nicene Creed in place of Apostolic Creed we usually use. In order to have smooth transition starting from September we will proclaim it one Sunday of a month. Further information about how and why this creed is important will be provided.

Starting September 12th our adoration will go back to its normal hours, namely, from after the mass at 12:10pm till 8:00pm.

Catechesis. SEA AND DESERT

Summary of the Holy Father's words

Dear brothers and sisters:

In this Audience, I invite you to join me in thinking of and praying for our brothers and sisters who even now seek to escape war, violence, persecution and disasters and set out in search of a land where they can live in peace and security. Many of these migrants, including young children, suffer greatly and die along the way. Most of these tragedies could be prevented. The teaching of Scripture is clear:

“God especially loves his children who are poor and in need, and we are called to help and defend them. Rather than more restrictive laws and the militarization of borders, what is needed is an expansion of secure and regular means of access, and a global governance of migrations based on justice, fraternity and solidarity.”

May we not turn a blind eye to these brothers and sisters, support those who seek to assist them and, above all, pray fervently for just solutions to this grave humanitarian crisis.
